Traffic and locomotives 'John Alcock' and the Bagnall still being under repair, the traffic is being moved by the Sentinel. Unfortunately, Robinson and Birdsell's cranes are all under repair and awaiting spare parts so traffic has been very light. This coming Saturday, December 9th., traffic will be moved by the Y7 which will be photographed and recorded during the day for an article and the proposed record. There will also be an amateur theatrical group making a short cine film of a character arriving by steam!

Civil Engineering Progress A group of members, perhaps with a sense of conscience and urgency in the matter, formed a Civil Engineering Sub-Committee last month to get things moving and make up for lost time. A long list of urgent jobs was made out, among them the relaying of the interchange loop, realignment of the Moor End curve to prevent buffer locking, re-designing the old King's Siding, and planning a new access siding to Robinson and Birdsell Ltd.

The Sub-Committee have started work in no uncertain way and great thanks must go to those members who have been going down to the railway during the week and weekends in the past month. The gang started at the B.R. Junction and have relayed the first 60' with a carefully planned curve of just under 5 chains radius and followed this up with the A and 6 turnout. Our most decayed and dangerous piece of track is now safe and tidy. It is satisfying to see heavy axles pass over fishplated joints without a trace of movement. Before the end of the year the loop should be servicable and then each side will be progressively relayed.

The greatest handicap is the delay in getting the locomotive down to propel the hand-crane loaded with new prefabricated track on to the site. To try to help matters the University members are rasing funds for a small Hunslet diesel shunter for use on Permanent Way trains.
