K THE DATE. SATURDAY 6th. March 1971

On March 5th. 1921, the branch from the Middleton Railway into Denison's to ndry was opened. This marked the end of an "expansion era" in the history of our line, which resulted in a greater diversity of traffic than ever before, and included the construction of the line to the preservation era's principal customers - Claytons, and Robinson and Birdsslls. Known as the Derivath Branch, it is now to be lifted in connection with the new motorway, o replaced by a completely new alignment.

In the process of laying a new gas main, the N.E.G.B. had to dig out one of the level crossing gate posts. This unfortuanately has not been replaced, and is lying near the site.

Down At The Line

The spring buffers off Chairman have been removed and have been fitted to Henry. Chairman is now due to be scrapped, providing the Midland Tar Distillers agree.

One good yard crane is to be made of the present two bad ones. The Middleton G.W. crane has a good frame but the boiler is worn-out. Clayton's steam crane has a serviceable boiler but a cracked frame. The two are to be combined and - Hey Presto! One useful crane!

The brake van is being repainted at present, and the interior has already lost that horrible yellow paint in favour of more sober colours. Thanks must go to Bill Holiday, Malcolm Phillips, Robin Brogden, and others for this work.

After a very poor response, could we please beg of members once again to sift through their attics and dig out anything at all which might be useful. Traffic Excitement

The MRT Trffic Dept. had an enquiry from Thomas Ward (Contractors) of Sheffield, who said that they would like us to transport an amount of ballast from Hunslet B.R. yard. Much was made of this, and much speculation was in the air as to how many thousands of tons needed moving. Then the bombshell dropped. There were only 50 tons. The Traffic Dept. were last seen banging their heads against a brick wall!

Excavation

From the tramway crossing down to Whittiker's Staithes has been excavated to a depth of three feet. All the good ash ballast their under the old trackbed was presumably being removed.
