The World's Oldest Railway is today acting as Host to many outside attractions, including:-

A. FAIRGROUND ORGANS AND ROUNDABOUT.

Gavioli 89 Key (built 1897). This was discovered in Prince Bernhardt Park, Apeldoorn, Hol'and, and restored by its present owners, L and W Cole of Leeds. It is mounted on a vintage 1926 Leyland "Badger".

"Limonaire Freres" 45-Key (built 1914). Owned by Mr. Bennett of Aberford.

Verbeck 46-Key (built 1914). Owned by Mr. Norman Dean

Dutch Organ. Owned by Mr. Brooksbank.

An "Olde Worlde" Fair Roundabout. Owned by Mr. Blaum of Armley.

B. ROAD VEHICLES.

Mann's Steam Tractor, 1916. A Leeds built general purpose engine, fitted with a dynamo to power the fairground organ. Owned by Mr. Cole.

Marshall Steam Roller. (6 n. h. p.) 1936. This fine machine has arrived under its own steam from Pudsey driven by its owner Mr. E.F. Whitehead.

<u>Dennis Fire Engine</u> 1940. Owned by Mr. D. Todd of Shadwell. During the day this vehicle will be used for watering the steam engines, and at about 4 p.m. it will give a <u>demonstration of fire fighting</u> by extinguishing a large bonfire of old railway sleepers and rubbish.

White Steam Car 1907. Owned by L and W Cole. Our 72 year old friend Mr. Cole has attended many veteran car events with this vehicle over the last 25 years. He was at the wheel - we nearly said "On the Footplate" - when it made a record-breaking time for steam vehicles on the London to Brighton Run. The top speed is known to be over 60 m. p. h.!

SPECIAL CHALLENGE. Mr. Cole and the "White Steamer" will take on and normal 2-wheel drive private car in a TUG OF WAR for a prize. Anyone wishing to take this up, please contact Mr. Cole or a Steward. (Entry Fee 2/6d).

C. AGRICULTURAL MACHINERY.

Stationary Steam Engine, 1915. Owned by Mr. J. Smith of Morley, this very interesting oil-fired engine has been on show at many rallies and will be at work during the day.

D. RAILWAY LOCOMOTIVES.

The Middleton Railway's rolling stock will be on view in the Yard. You can see:-

- 1880 (?) Steam Crane by Clyde Crane and Booth, built for G.W.R. Mixed gauge.
- 1891. North Eastern Railway 0-4-0T No. 1310 (Class Y7), Owned by Steam Power Trust.
- 1909 Borrows 0-4-0 WT "Windle", presented by Messrs. Pilkingtons of St. Helens.
- 1909 Avonside 0-6-0 ST Swansea, presented by Bynea Steel Company, at present undergoing restoration.
- 1917. Hudswell Clarke 0-4-0 ST, Oil-Fired "Henry de Lacy II" presented by Kirkstall Forge Engineering.
- 1920. Rodley Steam Crane.
- 1932 Hunslet 0-6-0 diesel "John Alcock".
- 1933 L.N.E.R. Sentinel Class Yl No. 54.- Working pressure 275 lbs. per sq. in.
- 1935 Hunslet 0-4-0 diesel John Courage.
- 1943 Fowler 0-4-0 diesel locomotive.
- 1953 Bagnall 0-4-0 ST "Matthew Murray". Fitter with Price Bagguley valve gear.

Owned by Mir. Becokehanie.

The Engineers in charge of the engines will be pleased to answer questions. Space in the yard is restricted, but when possible one engine will be in motion. In return for a donation to the appeal engines can be moved a short distance for photographs, and the steam crane set to work.
