## Entry to Claytons' Dartmouth Works

In view of recent thefts of the Company's property, there has been a general tightening of the security arrangements. ## Loco Progress

Henry de Lacy II was steamed on 1st May, after having a firebox crack welded. The loco., now in running order, will be used again for Sunday visitors' service. Carroll has out of service recently for gearbox repairs and for replacement of injectors which had been damaged by dirty fuel. Freight traffic was worked meanwhile by "Sweet Pea". Carroll is also minus its front panel, removed for repainting, which leads us to:-

# If it moves, paint it!

And if it doesn't move, still paint it ! And so, in accordance with this excellent motto, in the past couple of months large patches of Swansea have turned bright orange; several panels on Windle have turned a sort of pinkish-yellow colour; large areas of the Fowler have turned the same colour, on top of which the pits and scratches in the metal surface have been filled with a grey filler, making the engine look as if it had caught measles; and the Bagnall, with the exception of the new smokebox which still requires some finishing-off work, and of the boiler which is awaiting a hydraulic test, is now immaculate in marcon lined out in yellow, with a black underframe and scarlet buffer beams. Our thanks to Bill Holliday and Chris Jepson for their splendid work on the Bagnall; helpers will be more than welcome with the other engines. ## Civil Engineering

As any members who have been near the line within the last month or so will be all too well aware, the Motorway contactors have arrived at last. Preliminary work started early in March, with the laying of a concrete level crossing between the headshunt and the tram crossing, and work started in earnest on March 22nd with the arrival of piledrivers to construct the foundations for the bridge which is to carry the motorway over the line, and a fleet of huge earthmoving machines, the largest of them more than twice the size of a bus, which proceeded to remove about the top six feet of Calytons' field and the Moor. Shovels for digging out the level crossing before running trains became the order of the day. Also work started on the construction of the pedestrian underpass, which is parallel to the present line from the tram crossing to the headshunt, and barely inches clear of the leading gauge.

Finally, on April 1st (we hope the date is not significant) the line up to the Colliery was cut, and about 300 yds. of track was removed and dumped by the Moor Road platform. Work is now in progress on the construction of the bridge, and we hope to

have our line back in a couple of months or so.

One very annoying result of this is that, with the colliery inaccessible by rail, scrap metal thieves have taken the opportunity to steal a number of chairs from sleepers which were at the top end of the line. An official Permanent Way Engineer's curse has been laid upon them, and the Police have been informed, but so far nothing furthrt has happened.
